Dilution as a model of long-term forgetting

These spreadsheets illustrate the application of the PD model to the recall experiments of Krueger 1929 (Fig 3); Postman & Riley 1959 (Fig 4); Slamecka & McElree 1983 (Fig 5); Runquist 1983 (Fig 6); and Rubin, Hinton and Wenzel 1999 (Fig 7). It then covers the recognition experiments of Shepard 1967 (Fig 9); Strong 1913 (Fig 10); Fajnsztejn-Pollack 1973 (Fig 11); and Rubin, Hinton and Wenzel 1999 (Fig 12).

In all cases, optimization was carried out using the Excel Solver Add-in and the opening of that function will reveal both the optimized goodness-of-fit parameter and the parameter cells being optimized.
