

Description of different sheets in Appendix I:

Quantifications (2 sheets)

These two sheets list the Common Wares quantifications recovered from respectively the *Curiae Veteres* and the *Horti Lamiani* deposits. Columns A-C list the chronological Phase, the Activity and the Stratigraphic Unit (US) the material belongs to. The sherd (sh.) count and their weight in gram (gr.) of each US are listed in columns D-O sorted into the vessel's part (rim, base, handle and wall). Columns P-Q list the total recovered Common Ware sherds from each US and their weight.

Database (2 sheets)

These two sheets list the Common Wares examples I have identified from respectively the *Curiae Veteres* and the *Horti Lamiani* deposits. Column A lists the inventory number I attributed to each example, followed in columns B-D by the chronological Phase, Activity and Stratigraphic Unit (US) it belongs to. Column E displays the fabric of each example which could be Local/Regional (L/R), Gaulish (G) North African (A), Eastern/Aegean (E/Eg), or Unidentified (?). Column F lists the Ceramic Form the example belongs to, while column G the Ceramic Type I ascribed to it. Columns H-K display what part of the vessel is preserved and column L the number of sherds composing the example. Some measurements are listed in columns M-P, such as rim diameters (\emptyset) and the preserved percentage of the vessel's rim (%). Columns Q/T are devoted to various attributes characterizing the example as the presence of an external slip, decorations, an internal groove, or an external careen. Column U lists the reference to the figures in the Volume II of my thesis. The last column V is devoted to further observations on the example.
